#### **Preparing for Winter!**

Winter is approaching, and it is important to ensure everyone in our school community stays safe, warm, and healthy. Here are some tips:

#### a. At Home and School:

- Encourage a nutritious diet rich in seasonal fruits (e.g., oranges) and warm, energy-giving foods like soup, nuts, and milk to strengthen immunity.
- Stay hydrated, as dehydration often goes unnoticed during colder months.
- Practice regular handwashing to prevent the spread of illnesses.
- Teachers should ensure classrooms are ventilated but not overly cold.

#### b. On the Way to School (Especially in the Morning):

- Students should wear warm clothes in layers, including thermals, gloves, muffler, and cap.
- Ensure school bus windows are properly shut to block cold air.

#### c. Additional Suggestions:

- Teachers and staff should remind students to stay warm during outdoor activities.
- Parents can adjust home routines to ensure adequate study time while maintaining proper rest.
- Label all belongings such as jackets, sweaters, hoody, cap and muffler with the student's name or code to prevent misplacement.

#### d. Winter Uniform and Guidelines

- Students are encouraged to wear school-provided winter accessories, such as mufflers and caps, on time.
- On House Dress Day, ensure warm clothes are worn under the house dress for comfort.

### **Effective preparation for Second Term Examinations!**

#### a. Given Guidelines to follow:

The second term examinations are scheduled from 11<sup>th</sup> of next month. To prepare effectively, students have to follow the given guidelines:

- Be regular and sincere in all tasks to stay updated with lessons.
- Students are encouraged to revise thoroughly by calculating remained days and topics to revise. Grade VI onwards they are strongly suggested to follow the guideline on Effective Revisions and Fair Work Maintenance.
- They need to complete all pended assignment s and projects timely for effective revision practice.
- Parents may need to reschedule home routines to provide children with sufficient study time while balancing rest and recreation.
- For Basic Level students of grade I-VIII, strong supervision and motivation of parents and guardians is also highly needed. Parents may also communicate with respective grade teachers or subject teachers as per need regarding their observations if any queries.

### b. Effective Home Study Plan:

### Set Clear Goals:

- Plan what topics or chapters to cover each day and prioritize subjects that need more attention.

#### **Create a Routine:**

- Set specific hours for study, breaks, meals, and recreation. Maintain consistency for better focus. Choose a Quiet Study Space:

- Ensure the study area is free from distractions, well-lit, and comfortable.

#### **Use Study Tools:**

- Make use of notes, drawings, acronyms, flashcards, and mind maps to revise key points effectively. **Review regularly and Revise by maintaining Fair Work format:** 

- Dedicate some time each day to revise previously covered material. Regular reviews enhance retention. **Stay Healthy:**
- Balance study time with proper sleep, exercise, and nutrition to avoid burnout.

I hope that many students of middle school are already following above mentioned guideline and processes. That is wonderful sense of responsibilities and demonstration of qualities like self-organized approach and confidence on self. If not yet, this newsletter will definitely be an inspirational source. It's a pleasure to reconnect with you through this issue of subject-wise newsletter. Your enduring support and enthusiastic participation are what make Pathshala a vibrant and inclusive space for our students to thrive. Here's a glimpse of the academic and co-curricular activities in which our young learners engaged themselves in the past two months as a major part of 'Meaningful Education for Meaningful Life'.

#### 1. Tihar Celebrations:

#### **Grade 1: Sweet Making**

Grade one students engaged themselves in making Peda making activities. Making sweets is an interactive, hands-on activity. Students felt a sense of curiosity as they learnt about recipes, ingredients, and the cultural significance of the sweets.

### Grade 2 and 3 : Deusi Bhailo Presentations

#### 2. Other major Academic Activities:

#### a) Grade 1:

#### i) Zoo visit

Students of grade 1 visited central zoo, Lalitpur to identify the lives of animals at zoo. Additionally, they also explored the habitat, food and babies of the animals.



Global Hand Washing Day is celebrated to increase awareness and understanding about the importance of handwashing with soap as an effective and affordable way to prevent diseases and save lives. #### c) Grade 3:

#### i) World Kindness Day Celebration

#### ii) Educational Institution visit

understanding of society, reflect on their privileges, and learn how an individual can contribute positively to their community. They also shared some stationary items to the friends they meet at the schools as a small act of kindness and sharing culture.







#### d) Grade 4:

Students visited Bhaktapur Durbar square to explore the historical and cultural importance of the place. Major areas of the study were, Bhaktapur Durbar Square, *Nyatapole* temple, *Siddha Pokhari* integrating the social studies, mathematics, language arts, Arts and crafts etc.
