
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

Highlights of Baishakh Activities

Several interesting activities will take place in the first month:

- 20th (Grade 107) Curriculum Sharing Session: Both the parents are requested to join the session in order to understand the school system and provide better support in students learning.
- 22nd (Grade 1-7) Swimming classes: Swimming classes will start from this date focusing on water safety and physical fitness. You will receive a notice to confirm your child's participation.
- **26**th (**Grade 2**) **Buddha Jayanti Celebration**: Students learn the simple yet important preaching of Gautam Buddha and visit a stupa to interact with monk.
- 26th (Grade 8) Mother's Day Program: Students prepare poems, cards, and performances to express their gratitude towards their mothers.

Important Reminders for Parents

School Timing

- School runs from 8:45 AM to 3:30 PM for students.
- Morning assembly starts at 8:45 AM sharp, so all students must enter the school by 8:40 AM (after 8:30 only).

Bus Riders

- Bus riders have been informed about their **bus station** and **pick-up/drop-off time** by their **respective bus helpers.**
- Please make sure your child is ready and on time at the assigned bus stop 5-10 minutes earlier than the allotted time.

Walker Students

- Students who come on self or are dropped by their parents will **depart from the school between 3:40 PM and 3:45 PM**.
- They will enter the school and exit from the Walkers-Gate (for the safety of the students)

 Back side of the school, near Block C Pre-Uni block.

Snacks to students

• Snacks are provided only for grade 1-5 students. There will be no snacks for grade 6 and onwards.

Books and Copies

• Students in Grades 1 to 5 are not required to bring books to school unless specifically instructed by the teacher. They use the school-provided books during class time. For students in Grade 6 and above, proper orientation is given on carrying books and copies as per their class routine. They are not expected to bring all their books and copies every day.

Additional Reminders:

To ensure a smooth academic year, we kindly ask parents to:

- Ensure hydration and weather safety: Send a water bottle daily and a raincoat/umbrella as weather can be unpredictable.
- **Students Code Number**: All students are provided with their unique code number. Please write this code number in all the belongings that they bring school. in case of new students, you may write name until you get the code number.
- **Student Diary**: There are three pages to fill in the information; one is for school admin, one for GT and one remains in the diary. Please do fill all three pages carefully and completely.
- Use the School App: Important updates, notices, and academic details will be shared through the Pathshala mobile app. Login instructions will be sent soon to new parents.
- React on Viber: When a message is sent on Viber, please tap 💙 to confirm you've received it.
- Follow the school calendar and Parent Handbook: These contain important guidelines and dates. Please review them regularly.
- Maintain uniform and hygiene: Ensure that students come to school in clean, proper uniform every day.
