Meaningful Learning during Election Break and Assignments

As our country approaches the upcoming election, this is a meaningful time to help our children understand civic responsibility in an age-appropriate manner. I encourage you to talk to your child about the election process, discuss news updates together, and help them understand the importance of informed decision-making. For younger children, this could mean explaining what voting means and why it matters. For middle and senior students, you may guide them to follow reliable news sources and reflect on current affairs.

To ensure that subject based learning also continues during this period, revision-based worksheets and subject-wise assignments have been provided. These tasks are mainly focused on reinforcement and practice. You are humbly requested to encourage with support to your child to do assignments with sense of responsibility and commitment.

There will be some more 'post-election' activities integrated with different subjects and age—level

groups after school resumes.

For students: Developing Study Habit:

The upcoming election break can be a valuable opportunity to prepare for the Final Examination. As the routine and syllabus have already been shared, I encourage every student to create a simple daily study plan, dividing time wisely among subjects and revising one topic at a time, on a priority basis. Complete all assignments given by teachers, as they are designed for practice and clarity. Students may focus on understanding concepts rather than memorizing, solve past questions, and review mistakes carefully. For any confusion, you mark it and get clarification from the teachers after we resume classes. I request parents to support by maintaining a quiet study environment at home, monitoring progress gently, and encouraging disciplined study habits. This practice is not only to do better in tests and exams, but also to develop a study habit to be a better learner in the long run.

Follow HOME-ROUTINE and CONTINUE WITH FAIR—PRACTICE WORK OF EVERY SUBJECTS besides the Elections-Days'-Assignments.

Strong Reminder: Separate Practice-Fair Exercise Books are always recommended to maintain and is mandatory.

Annual Information Update

As we prepare for the new academic session, we had requested you to complete the Annual Information Update 2082 form. I sincerely appreciate your cooperation by sending it timely. This form includes updating your contact information, current address details, and confirming your child's continuity for the upcoming year. Accurate and updated records help us maintain clear communication and ensure smooth academic planning. Your prompt response greatly support the school in organizing classes and resources effectively.

Review in the fee structure

We would like to inform you, with due respect and transparency, that the school fee is reviewed once every two years. As the year 2083 marks the scheduled review cycle, there will be a 10-12% increment in the current fee structure. This revision is carried out thoughtfully to maintain the quality of education, facilities, and services we provide to our students.

Please note that once revised, the fee will remain unchanged for two years, till the year 2084. Also, the variation in fees across different classes or levels is based on academic structure and requirements of each grade, and not solely due to this review. We sincerely appreciate your understanding and continued support as we strive to provide our children with meaningful education.

From the Desk of Academic Coordinator

Warm greetings to all our respected parents, guardians, and well-wishers.

At Pathshala Nepal Foundation, we continuously strive to provide meaningful learning experiences that extend beyond textbooks. Our approach nurtures academic excellence while equally fostering students’ socio-emotional and behavioral growth.

The Annual Outdoor Community Study of grade VIII was conducted from 23rd to 28th Poush as part of our experiential learning approach. Grade VIII students explored Eastern Nepal, where they engaged in a community study of the Musahar community and examined the historical significance of Sindhuligadhi Fort. Their learning further included a geographical and economic study of Kanyam Tea Estate, tourism exploration in Shree Antu, and an understanding of the religious and cultural importance of Baraha Kshetra.





Similarly, **Grade VII** students visited Nawalpur–Sauraha from 24th to 27th Poush, gaining hands-on exposure to the ecological and cultural diversity of Chitwan National Park. They also studied the socio-cultural life of the Tharu and Bote communities, the religious significance of Devghat, and the economic aspects of hotel management and tourism in Sauraha. These experiential journeys significantly strengthened students’ observation skills, teamwork, research **capacity, and real-world understanding**.

A Terminal Department Workshop was conducted on 2082-10-06 with a focus on effective lesson planning, creative material preparation, academic integration through an art exhibition, and structured planning for Pathshala Assemblies. The workshop reinforced our commitment to reflective teaching practices and collaborative academic planning.

Grade VII organized a meaningful program to commemorate Martyrs’ Day, honoring the martyrs for their love, sacrifice, and dedication to the nation. The program fostered patriotism, respect for history, and civic awareness among students.



Grade V students visited Khagendra Navajeevan Kendra, Jorpati, and subsequently shared thoughtful reflective journals. The visit emphasized empathy, inclusion, compassion, equality, and respect for diversity, helping students develop a deeper understanding of inclusive values and social responsibility.



We were also pleased to host a parent engagement session on 8th Falgun with Mrs. Anamica Gauchan, mother of Sherli Doma Sherpa (Grade I), who shared insights about the **Sherpa community** as a religious and linguistic group, along with the significance of **Lhosar** as part of our school-based curriculum. Students explored the history, social life, and cultural practices of the Sherpa community. A key takeaway from the session was the understanding that while a community may share common roots, variations in dress, food, customs, and lifestyle occur according to region, and culture reflects daily life practices. Such interactive sessions meaningfully strengthen our school-home partnership.

Pathshala Class Assemblies, conducted from 2082-10-17 to 2082-10-23, served as structured platforms to showcase academic achievements in curricular areas, co-curricular activities that support academic growth, and the development of socio-emotional and behavioral competencies. These assemblies continue to build confidence, communication skills, and leadership qualities among our learners.

The Mid-Term Examination (Falgun) has been successfully completed. Answer sheets are currently under evaluation, and result preparation is in progress. Results will be shared with parents on the 24th, 25th, and 26th of Falgun. For selected students, a Parent-Teacher Conference (PTC) will be scheduled to discuss academic progress and provide necessary support strategies.

Age-appropriate **election-related assignments**, along with revision-based tasks, have been assigned for the election break. These activities are designed to maintain continuity between school and home while fostering students’ curiosity and awareness about current events and developments around them. Please, provide required support and learning environment to relate learning in real life experiences.

An Advisement Session with students is scheduled for the 27th and 28th of Falgun. During this session, respective advisors will support students in reviewing their performance, identifying their strengths, and recognizing areas that require immediate improvement in academics, skills, and behavior. Students will also be guided with effective strategies to prepare for the upcoming Final Examinations. Parents and guardians are kindly requested to follow up with their child at home and maintain regular communication with the Grade Teacher at school to ensure consistent support and progress.

The Final Examination for the current academic session is scheduled to commence from the 6th of Chaitra. **The Basic Level Examination (BLE) – VIII** will begin from the 5th of Chaitra. The routine for the BLE has already been shared. The syllabus and examination routine for Grades IV–VII have been sent home with the students today. We kindly request all parents and guardians to carefully go through the syllabus and encourage students to keep both the routine and syllabus displayed in their study area for regular reference. Students are advised to prepare thoroughly by studying their textbooks, reference books, worksheets, handouts maintained in their subject-wise folders, exercise books, and Practice Exercise Books (PEB).

Moving forward, Pathshala Nepal Foundation remains dedicated in its commitment to holistic education—balancing academic growth with creativity, responsibility, and emotional intelligence. We sincerely appreciate the continued trust and cooperation of our parents and guardians.

Monthly Highlights:

Grade 1: Educational Field trip- Bakery visit

As a part of our School-Made Curriculum (SMC), our first graders visited the bakery 'UG Cakes' at Surya Bikram Marg, Kathmandu on 13th and 14th Falgun. The major objective of the visit was to retell the importance of bakery as economic activities and to get familiar to the responsibilities of the people involved in the bakery business. The students actively communicated with the resource person and collected information. The visit provided them with an opportunity to observe and learn the process of making bakery items along with the required ingredients and recognize various machines and tools used in the process.



Grade 2: Narayanhiti Palace Museum visit

Our second graders visited Narayanhiti Museum on 11th Falgun with the objective of exploring the importance of historical place and to identify rules and regulations to be followed in the museum. The students visited the place, observed various things and filled the trip sheet. It is believed that visiting historical places helps to increase the respect and love towards nation and its history.

Grade 3: Hanuman Dhoka Durbar Square

Our third graders visited Hanuman Dhoka Durbar Square on 13th Falgun with the objective of exploring the significance of the historical place and identify the importance of cultural heritage. Students observed the Kumari ghar and received blessing from goddess Kumari. They visited museum and collected information about the past and present condition of the place. They could look Kathmandu valley from all four direction from Nau Talle Durbar and visited different temples in the durbar square.
